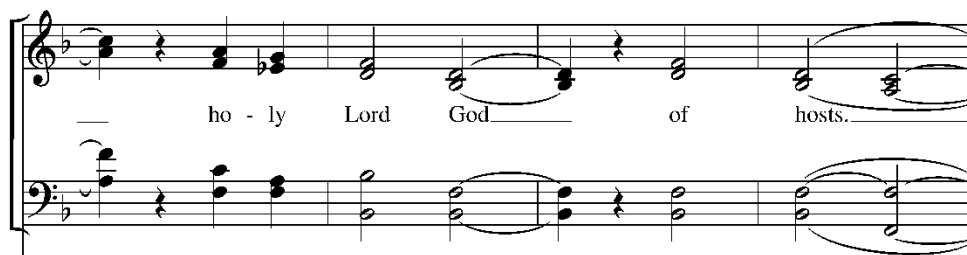
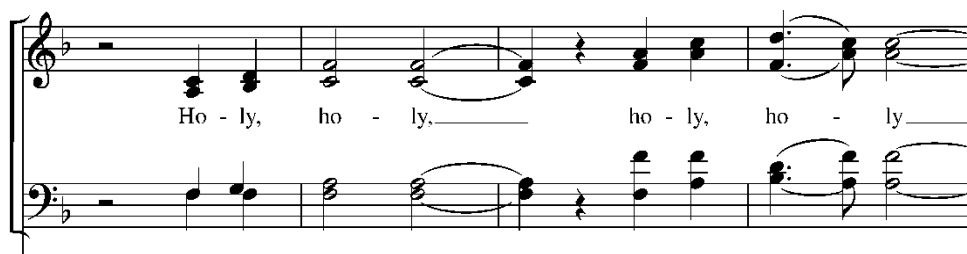
Presider Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

we lift our voices with all creation as we sing (say):



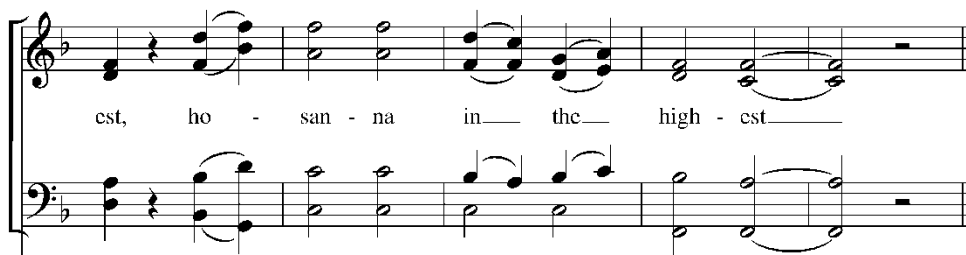

Blessed are you, gracious God,

*At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or lay a
hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon
the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.*

On the night before he died for us,
Our Savior Jesus Christ took bread,
and when he had given thanks to you, he
broke it, and gave it to his friends, and
said: "Take, eat: This is my Body which is
given for you. Do this for the
remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup
of wine, and when he had given thanks,

Through Abraham and Sarah
you called us into covenant with you.
You delivered us from slavery,
sustained us in the wilderness,
and raised up prophets
to renew your promise of salvation.

Then, in the fullness of time,
you sent your eternal Word,
made mortal flesh in Jesus.
Born into the human family,
and dwelling among us,
he revealed your glory.
Giving himself freely to death on the
cross, he triumphed over evil,
opening the way of freedom and life.

he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this,
all of you: This is my Blood of the new
Covenant, which is poured out for you
and for all for the forgiveness of sins.
Whenever you drink it, do this for the
remembrance of me."

The Communion

All who are baptized and permitted to receive Communion in their own traditions are welcome at Our Lord's Table. Come up to the Altar Rail and stand or kneel. Receive the Bread or gluten-free Host in your hand, and either consume it and drink from the Chalice, or dip the Host into the Chalice when it comes to you. (Ask the Presider if you require gluten-

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free.) If you wish to receive a blessing instead of Communion, please simply cross your hands over your chest.
